CURATOR'S NOTE LEE SHARROCK

Arms Around the Child provide homes and medicines for HIV+ orphaned children in India, supports abandoned, abused and orphaned children often rescued from slavery and trafficking in Ghana, and run programmes in South Africa that help children who have been affected by sexual abuse, HIV/AIDS, and are living in child-headed households.

The Covid-19 Pandemic made life difficult for everyone, but it was particularly hard for the AATC director, Ellie Milner, to continue to raise enough funds during the pandemic to support the children that the charity provides care for in Africa and India, and life was even more difficult for these children, many of whom are HIV+ and orphaned. So we are thrilled that the Arms Around the Child fundraising art auction can finally go ahead after being put on hold for over 2 years due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Thank you to Christie's for offering their beautiful King Street auction rooms for our exhibition and live auctions, and to The Auction Collective for hosting the online auction and providing the expertise of auctioneer Tom Best.

The online auction hosted by The Auction Collective, and the live

auction at Christie's, will raise much-needed funds to help Arms Around the Child complete the construction of a school in Senya Beraku, Ghana, and will build on the success of previous auctions, which enabled the charity to build a children's home in Jaipur, India.

Ellie Milner, Director of Arms Around the Child, invited the legendary musician Neneh Cherry to guest curate the auction, and we have artwork created by musicians Chrissie Hynde, David Byrne and Maxim featured, as well as an image by Jamie Reid recognisable from the iconic Sex Pistols 'Never mind the Bollocks' album cover, showing the crossover between the worlds of art and music.

It's been really enjoyable to cocurate the auction with my friend Bakul Patki and we are so grateful for the generosity of the artists who have donated.

Thank you to Jason Colchin-Carter and Peter Wells-Thorpe who have also secured significant donations from contemporary artists. We have donations from rising stars and established artists hailing from Africa, Asia, India, the UK and the USA, reflecting the international nature of the contemporary art world.

Christian's art is heavily influenced by graphics, paint, photography, acrylic, 3D, silhouettes, gilding, vivid colours, and tonal matching. His most celebrated work is inspired by people, environments and nature and his ongoing series titled 'The Birds' released in October 2020 and updated in 2022 plays on the themes of

freedom, fantasy and escapism in flight, against the backdrop of the ongoing global pandemic, war, displacement and our place in a new future. Golden Flock his most popular print to date was re-created as a 23ct gold screenprint highlighting that we have to work as one to accomplish anything in life. All of Christian's limited edition prints are printed in London on the finest Giclée Hahnemühle Bamboo or Photoraa Fine Art papers. His professional art prints are made using the very best highdefinition equipment and finest materials, all overseen by master printers. In addition to his website, his gallery edition screen prints, originals and fine art prints are available to view at Gallery at Ice in Windsor.

British contemporary artist Dan Baldwin (b. 1972, Manchester) began his artistic career at Eastbourne College of Art and Design in 1995, and later received a BA (Hons) from Kent Institute of Art and Design. After graduating he worked as a studio associate tutoring younger art students, and during this time started receiving commissions and moved to Brighton where he acquired his own studio. Pop Art has always been a major influence in Baldwin's working practice, artists such as Warhol, Sir Peter Blake, Jean-Michael Basquiat, David Hockney, and Robert Rauschenberg. After developing his style and ideas and exploring printmaking as a new medium Baldwin began working as a full-time artist and showing with galleries in London and Brighton.

Primarily working as a painter, Baldwin is also recognised for his silkscreens and had a retrospective of select print works at the Saatchi gallery in 2016, as well as his ceramic works, sculpture is also a medium he has embraced, working with a foundry in Athens on lost wax methods of casting in bronze.

He has collaborated on many projects such as book covers, album cover artwork and fashion collaborations, and has seen his work printed onto furniture, skis, skateboards, silk scarfs, tracksuits and many other mediums over the years.

His work has been exhibited in galleries and art fairs all over the world, including in Basel, London, Tokyo, Miami, Los Angeles, San Francisco and New York. Collectors include leading artists such as Damien Hirst, Gilbert & George and Jake Chapman, and celebrities such as Bernie Ecclestone, Pete Townsend, & Sir Ronald Cohen, Baldwin has worked with global brands, including Paolo Nutini and Max Factor, fashion/clothing designers such as Sara Berman, & Mercy Delta and charities including British Heart Foundation, Teenage Cancer Trust, Teen Cancer U.S.A, Help Refugees, Big Issue and C.A.L.M. (Campaign Against Living Miserably), and has appeared in magazines such as Elle, Dazed & Confused, Time Out NYC, and Modern Painters.



Bartholomew Beal 24/8/1989 - 26/12/2019 Bartholomew (Barley to his friends) graduated with a BA in Fine Art Painting from Wimbledon College of Art in 2012 with a 1st class degree. His degree show exhibition at Wimbledon College sold out and that was where Jason Colchin-Carter met him and saw his work for the first time at the Private View June 15th 2012 at Wimbledon College of Art Graduate Show. He was able to see at first hand, discuss and understand the obvious talent demonstrated in his work which was being exhibited. Bartholomew Beal was exceptionally impressive being able to speak very lucidly about his work and ideas, his love of language, literature, and

Jason Colchin-Carter expressed my interest in supporting him and working with him to help him forge ahead. As a result, a working relationship of management and representation by Jason Colchin-Carter developed that lasted to the end of 2016. After agreeing to work together Barley informed Jason Colchin-Carter he had entered and won the Jonathan Vickers Residency - the UK's biggest financial award residency in excess of £30k for a full year with Studio, materials & a jolly nice small support team.

Jason Colchin-Carter was thrilled for him and determined, even more, to make a success of his practice with him. Exhibitions were mostly sold-out with a demand for Studio commissions on top, no easy feat for a young new Artist. During this exciting growth period, they held many exhibitions including Mall Gallery - 'Biscuit. I've kept you half' 2013, Vickers residency - Art Gallery, Derby & Derby Museum 'Saint Monday' - 2013, a collaboration with IP Arts and FAS Bond Street for 2 Solo exhibitions 'A heap of Broken Images' 2014 and 'This great stage of folks' 2016.

Bartholomew Beal was the youngest artist to exhibit at the FAS which at the time was the oldest Gallery in the UK established over 170 years previously. Jason Colchin-Carter remembers seeing him whooping with joy when he told Bartholomew Beal about the exhibitions that had secured for him.

In 1978 Beale exhibited Collected from Here, a series of sculptures and photographs about her mother's orchard at the Angela Flowers Gallery in London. Soon after, she exhibited thousands of real apples at the Richard Demarco Gallery in Edinburgh. Since the 1970s Philippa has exhibited work at the Institute of Contemporary Arts in London, the Arnolfini in Bristol, the Fruit Market in Edinburgh, the Royal Academy of Arts, and many major galleries. In 2009, Beale moved to France and made a permanent installation at the Church of the Virgin in Vaux,

Valence en Poitou. In 2009, Beale started painting trees as part of her new polemic concerning the environment, resulting in an invitation to exhibit in 2013 in Under the Greenwood, Picturing the British Tree, at St Barbe Museum in the New Forest. In 2014 she was a founder member of the Arborealists Movement.

Mr Brainwash is the moniker of Los Angeles-based filmmaker and Pop artist Thierry Guetta. He has spent the better part of the last decade attempting to make the ultimate street art documentary. Meanwhile, inspired by his subjects, he started hitting the streets, from Los Angeles to Paris, with spray painted stencils and posters of his pop art inspired images. He rapidly emerged as a renowned figure on the international street art scene. Considered as one of the most prolific and talked about artists of today, Mr Brainwash is also the subject of

Banksy's documentary "Exit Through The Gift Shop. Using Guetta's street art footage, Banksy eventually turned the camera on the only man who ever filmed him. The collaboration resulted in a remarkable documentary that is part personal journey and part an exposé of the art world with its mind-altering mix of hot air and hype.

Description: The land of the blessed dead - in ancient Egypt the colour green was associated with death and the power of resurrection as well as new life and fertility. They believed that a wonderful place of eternal paradise, resembling their lives, but without any pain or suffering and referred to this place as the 'field of malachite'.

Born in the fishing village of Emsworth, Hampshire in 1969, Paul's interest and fascination in the ocean and natural history,

taxidermy and curiosities grew from an early age. One of his greatest influences was his grandfather who was an eel fisherman and naive painter. Trained as a cabinet maker, Paul began a carving and gilding apprenticeship with David Goodman, the fine art framer and paintings conservator. He has framed art works by David Hockney, Paul Nash, Renoir, Dali, Kandinsky, to name but a few. Working as a freelance conservator, Paul meticulously restored and conserved many historical and important pieces from numerous National Trust and English Heritage properties, including Osterley Park, Uppark House and Buckingham Palace. Pauls attention to detail, expertise in traditional gilding, framing techniques and taxidermy skills combine to create his ethereal and magical assemblage boxes. The taxidermy used in Paul's work are mostly vintage pieces. Any new pieces are legally obtained. Returning from France in 2007 Paul lives and works in North Devon near the sea, surfing and fishing.

Martin Brown is an Australian-born, London-based artist (Australian/British) whose paintings deal primarily with the built environment, especially urban spaces. Drawing on the history of painting in the Western tradition, to explore ideas of memory and perception as they relate to the architecture and topography of modern cities. Through the employment and layering of different painterly styles and techniques, producing work that reveals the traces of the past in the present moment, forming visual 'timelines' in a single picture.

The Artwork featured is a watercolour, ink and graphite study for the larger oil painting titled "The Boston, Tufnell Park" which was previously exhibited in the Exhibition Displacement in Paris 2016. The Artwork "The Boston, Tufnell Park, study" was made in preparation for the larger work, it is a scene of an intersection near where the artist lives in North London. The work was made "en plein air" and has not previously been exhibited.

After a formative period of exhibiting extensively in Australia from the mid 90's, Martin relocated to London in 2003. Since then, he has had solo shows in London, Basel, Paris and most recently a solo exhibition in Venice. He is currently based in London and Northern Italy.



Justin BUA is an award-winning artist, author, speaker, and entrepreneur. Ground-breaking in his field, BUA is internationally known for his best-selling collection of fine art posters—The DJ being one of the most popular prints of all time.

Born in 1968 in NYC's untamed Upper West Side and raised between Manhattan and East Flatbush, Brooklyn, BUA was fascinated by the raw, visceral street life of the city. He attended the Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music and Performing Arts and complemented his education on the streets by writing graffiti and performing worldwide with breakdancing crews. BUA went on to the Art Centre College of Design in Pasadena, California where he earned a B.F.A. and taught figure drawing at the University of Southern California for ten years.

Chila Kumari Singh Burman is celebrated for her radical feminist practice which examines representation, gender and cultural identity. She works across a wide range of mediums including printmaking, drawing, painting, installation and film.

Born in Bootle, to Punjabi-Hindu parents, she attended Southport College of Art, Leeds Polytechnic and the Slade School of Fine Art. A key figure in the British Black Arts movement in the 1980s, Burman has since remained rooted in her understanding of the diverse nature of culture. Continually seeking to break stereotypes and emancipate the image of women, she often uses self-portraiture as a tool of empowerment and self-determination.

Burman was selected as the fourth artist to complete the Tate Britain Winter Commission in 2020. The resulting hugely popular installation Remembering A Brave New World, addressed the colonial history of Tate Britain and its Eurocentric position. Adorning the gallery façade with references to Indian mythology, popular culture, female empowerment, political activism and colonial legacy. Exposing a need for better informed conversations and more effective strategies for tackling racism in the art world and wider society. More recently she has gone on to complete high profile light installation projects for Covent Garden's historic market stall building, Liverpool Town Hall and Blackpool's Grade II listed Grundy Art Gallery. She recently featured in Sky Arts documentary special Statues Redressed and BBC2 documentary Art That Made Us. And has completed a number of notable commission pieces for brands including Netflix's White Tiger campaign and Byredo's new fragrance Mumbai Noise.

Represented by the Pace McGill Gallery in New York, and best known as the frontman of art-rock group the Talking Heads, David Byrne is an established visual artist whose work has been shown in contemporary galleries and museums

around the world since the 1990s.

He released a sketchbook facsimile of his Tree Drawings, 'Arboretum', in 2006 and his original artwork featured in the 2010 exhibition, 'The Record: Contemporary Art and Vinyl' at the Nasher Museum of Art at Duke University.

Like his music, Byrne's visual work has the capacity to elevate and transform ordinary elements into iconic ones, challenging our fundamental notions of what can be classified as art.

Byrne mounts many of his shows in untraditional exhibition spaces, frequently mixes text with images, and often incorporates audio components, and his work belongs to numerous collections, including the Denver Art Museum and the Southeastern Center for Contemporary Art in Winston-Salem, N.C.

Rob and Nick Carter are a London based husband-and-wife artistic duo who have been collaborating for over 20 years.



Newton Cavalcanti, born in 1930 in Rio de Janeiro began his training in the studio of Oswald Goeldi, a master of woodcut technique and one of the most important figures in the development of modern Brazilian printmaking. He subsequently entered the Escola de Belas Artes at the State University of Rio de Janeiro (1954), and went on to study art education at the Escolinha de Arte do Brasil in 1962. Cavalcanti was professor of printmaking at the Centro Educacional de Niterói, 1960 – 1976, and also taught at the Universidade de Brasília and

at the Instituto de Artes Visuais, Inaert. Several books of his prints and illustrations have been published. Cavalcanti stayed in Europe, completing courses in Italy, Germany and England, where his work was subsequently shown at the Canning House Gallery. During the 1980s Cavalcanti collaborated on several short films, and designed scenery for the performance of the opera the Barber of Seville at the Teatro Municipal in Rio de Janeiro. More recently, his work has been included within collective exhibitions, many of which focus upon the development of Brazilian printmaking. He died in 2006.

Born in 1975 in Mourenx (France) Fabrice Cazenave principally uses drawing to explore the close connections that operate between a place, the people who pass through it and the resulting energy flows. He seeks to discover how an environment is able to transform us through the sensations it gives us, and how our cognitive biases, our knowledge, our beliefs can distort our perceptions and our understanding of the world. His approach is based on observation and experimentation: through self-hypnosis processes he enters into relation with the elements that make up the chosen landscape in order to try to detect its sensory imprint, the persistence of bodies on the memory of premises.



Charles Uzzell Edwards a.k.a. PURE EVIL grew up in Wales and was by his own account the only new romantic in the village. He spent his teenage years customizing his clothes and experimenting with eyeliner and this love of urban street style led him to do fashion degree in London where he earned a bit of a reputation as a troublemaker.

Skateboarding was another of his loves and after the Poll Tax Riots in Trafalgar Square he decided to leave Thatcherite London for a two-week trip to California, which ended up being a 10-year stay in San Francisco.

He became one of the designers for streetwear clothing line 'ANARCHIC ADJUSTMENT' and immersed himself in the music scene out there, where it seemed a British invasion of artists, musicians and DJs had hit the West Coast like a tsunami, moving there to avoid the criminal justice bill, throwing parties under full moons on the beaches of California, making electronic music and streetwear clothing for ravers, skateboarders and Silicon Valley tech guru's.

It was there that Charles started to notice the character street artwork of 'TWIST' and 'REMINISCE' and the work of other skateboard and graffiti artists, and on his return to London in 2000 he hit the ground running and after a stint working at Banksy's SANTAS GHETTO Guerrilla retail show, he started stencilling and spraying his signature bunny tag around London. The character came from the guilt he felt when he shot and killed a rabbit in the countryside when he was 10.

In 2007 Charles opened Pure Evil Gallery his first gallery in Shoreditch on Leonard Street and six years later opened the second larger gallery two doors from the original space. The galleries have been an incubator for up-and-coming street artists from around the world and are the studio for Charles' own PURE EVIL artwork. The success of his Nightmare series of dripping celebrity portraits has taken him around the world and has recently had successful shows across the USA, and in Hong Kong, Sri Lanka, France, Germany, Sweden, Norway, Brazil and even Mongolia.

Born and raised in Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe), when her parents moved to London in 1965, 11-year old Jill Furmanovsky became a member of the Beatles fan-club and an 'Apple Scruff' – one of the teenagers who hung around outside Abbey Road Studios, hoping to catch sight of the Fab Four.

Legendary Rock artists she has photographed in her 40 year career include Pink Floyd, Bob Marley, Eric Clapton, Blondie, The Police, Led Zeppelin, The Pretenders, Bob Dylan and Oasis.

Jill Furmanovsky has won many awards for her music photography, including 'Woman of the Year' for Music and Related Industries (1988) and the prestigious Jane Brown Observer Portrait Award (1992).



In the late 1990s Toni graduated from Brunel University. After a stint training as an Ice Carver, Gallagher decided she needed a slightly warmer career path. Toni came in from the cold and spent the next few years as an Art Director in commercials. In November 2012 she held her first solo art exhibition, "The Gluttonous Lady Who Swallowed a Fly" to much critical acclaim. Gregory de la Haba is an American interdisciplinary artist, writer, curator, and cultural producer. A skilled painter with a pedagogical lineage that stretches back to Jacques Louis Davide, he is an exemplary practitioner of fine art whose conceptual practice resists categorization. 


Reece Jones graduated from the Royal Academy Schools in 2002 going on to co-establish the Rockwell Project Space in Hackney, London. His work has been shown extensively worldwide and is featured in many significant collections. Reece's practice is process led challenging some of the potential preconceptions of what we mean by 'drawing' and what certain materials are traditionally encouraged to do. Reece will often invent images, culling from a broad archive of source material and developing rangy, fantastical imagery.

He's essentially interested in using fragile, shifting materials to reference intangible, uncertain spaces, objects and ideas. Recurrent themes in his work include reference to the sublime and to the American Wilderness, modernism, land art, archaeology, cinema, mythology, spectacle, menace, photography and time. His studio practice is labour intensive and requires a constant reconsideration of the implications of skill and craft. Sometimes the outcome is dreamlike and beautiful, sometimes ominous, sometimes downright awkward.

I was born in 1978 in Japan and I moved to Berlin 1998 to begin my studies at the Berlin University of the Arts, as master class student of Daniel Richter. I am internationally active artist and work galleries from bverschiedenen countries. I exhibit my works in galleries, museums, art associations and art fairs. I have won 2 important art awards in Germany and Japan.

With my art I try to take up the ambivalent symbiosis between humans and nature. We exist with nature and we cannot exist without it. At the same time, we destroy it. My abstract and realistic figures act in an apparent and deep-rooted interrelation with each other. The figures move in border areas of the visible and not immediately visible. To express these themes with my art, I have developed my very own and personal artistic language. In my works, abstract and realistic elements merge in a unique expression and visual language. In the process, the contrast of strong color and gray tones and the free composition of the figures, which are superimposed on each other in several realistic and abstract layers and different layers of expression, also reinforces the meaning of the content.



Poppy Lennox is a London based artist who creates unique works on paper and wood incorporating gold leaf, paint and embroidery.

Poppy plays with the contrast between the delicacy of woven thread through its hard wooden 'canvas' with the vivid, bold and exotic fauna that predominate her works. Vibrant colours permeate her abstract figures, creating a fantastical quality that oscillates between the real and imaginary.

As if following traditional forms of embroidery, Poppy is drawn to symmetry and repetition. The titles of her works help the viewer understand the importance of this meditative dimension in her working process: they allude to a kind of pursuit of ascension, self-liberation or, perhaps, refuge. In this sense, Poppy embraces spirituality in her work and follows a long tradition of artists who have used their art as an aid to look for transcendence and subject matters that go beyond a physical level.

Her abstract winged creatures, an often-seen symbol, offer a source of ambiguity and tension. Although signifying liberation and flight, in this space they may be viewed as captured static patterns forever tied to their surface.

Poppy has exhibited in a number of group exhibitions and art fairs and currently has work in The Savoy and Home House, London. Her work is widely collected both in the UK and abroad.



Emma Loizides is a British cityscape painter based in London. Emma creates oil paintings of energetic urban landscapes with a bright and colourful palette.

After Studying Spanish at university and spending years working in banking, Emma admired the city skyline and in 2005 started painting. She would sketch London in the early morning and soak in the atmosphere of the city, capturing the subtle magic of sunrise. Emma's candy-coloured street scenes and idealised

landscapes are about escapism, portraying a moment of calm.

Emma spent a few years living in Las Vegas and enjoyed travelling the west coast of America. Beaches, sunsets, and palm trees feature in her paintings and the quirky buildings and spacious landscape has influenced her work. Emma has a keen interest in Americana and loves painting gumball machines, juke boxes, taco trucks or fast-food menus, taking inspiration from pop art and artists Jasper Johns, Edward Hopper, and Wayne Thiebaud.

Emma's painting "Monos" was exhibited in this year's Summer Exhibition at the Royal Academy. She has sold work globally and has collectors in the USA, Australia, Monaco, and Cyprus, and had work featured in the Hollywood Reporter. Emma creates playful, uplifting works taking the viewer on a journey around the streets of London and faraway places including Vegas, New York, and Hollywood.

Multidisciplinary British artist Paul Robinson (aka LUAP) dynamically fuses adventure and art through his paintings and photography, drawing from his own experiences. His adult-size Pink Bear suit follows him up mountains, through surreal landscapes, bustling cities and remote spots in far-away places, juxtaposing them in stark contrast with his central figure The Pink Bear. Using different mediums and techniques, he tackles mental health, the climate and ecological emergency, and isolation head-on.

LUAP's style, although hinting at abstract expressionism, is not confined to one system as he seamlessly fuses expressionist mark making with photorealistic painting techniques. His works explodes with positive energy, bringing together the bold colours of Pop Art and the soft grunge of modern Urban Art. Exploring existential subjects, but within a contemporary feel, his craft stands alone in its composition and provoking content and subject matter.

The Pink Bear acts as a tool to juxtapose and create stark contrasts within a chosen context, existing somewhere between reality and make-believe, and youthful innocence and corruption. The Pink Bear reincarnated from an old childhood memory whilst in therapy, leaving the familiar confines and security of youthful innocence to find a place in the 'real world' and serve as a guiding light. The candy-coloured teddy accompanies LUAP on his travels and serves as a metaphor for discovery and exploration.

Joe Machine is a world-renowned artist, illustrator and writer described by the legendary art critic Edward Lucie-Smith as being the successor to Francis Bacon and William Blake. Having risen from a troubled upbringing and involvement in crime, he has become one of the most important British artists.

He is a founder member of the Stuckist art movement and painter in residence for the Prometheus Project in Trieste, Italy. He is known for his instantly recognisable style of painting which incorporates archetypal imagery and esoteric symbolism within his religious and mythological works.

The world is my stage, both with regards to everyday as well as to grand gestures: large paintings, complex stage design, international collaboration or teaching at my school is just as much part of my multi-layered artistic work, as the interior design of my flat or the preparing of my meal – I create aesthetic composition in each aspect of my life.

Painting is the backbone of my work. I create large, abstract-expressionistic images, diptychs or triptychs, which have reign over the space they populate. I work with acrylics, lacquer, charcoal and pencil, and gestural lines, drips and planes. The canvas is often unstretched and stapled to the wall or floor so that it can take my whole body and energy. I am not necessarily careful and work physically with my entire body, to leave powerful gestures. Emotions, which I carry inside of me, I transfer and materialise.

Construction and destruction of colours, lines and planes are a united entity to create something on the canvas that touches people. A transference through matter.

Music and dance are the origin of art and most definitely the origin of my own art. As a six-year-old, I was already dancing ballet. This movement of my body as an expression of emotion is still visible in the way I bring colour onto the canvas. It is not a tentative scurrying, but powerful and broad movements, energy, which is worked into the canvas, into a two-dimensional state.

Alison McKenna (Croydon, 1970) uses bold colour passages in sophisticated combinations to express energy, space, weight and movement in her paintings, often defining and anointing her work with a finishing touch in graphite. McKenna's paintings, drawings and sculptures are consecrated actions she considers magical, and their creation as an initiation. Recent paintings have involved repeated visits to specific places – notably in Sussex and Andalucia – which she feels draw her in, enabling her to focus and 'bring down' the energy of the location.

McKenna also has a particular interest in the esoteric history of the Feminine, from The White Goddess and Moon worship to the extraordinary power of the 30,000 women strong Embrace The Base action at the Greenham Common nuclear air base in 1982. She has worked at sites with specific historic resonance, like Greenham and the Waun Mawn neolithic site in the Preseli Mountains. Paintings are less renditions of form than expressions of locational energy, usually rendered in smooth enamel paints.

Colin was born in Belfast in 1977 and studied at Central St.Martins College of Art in London, where he still lives and works. After being awarded the Royal Ulster Academy student prize he has shown at art fairs and exhibitions in Glasgow, New York, Miami, London and has had solo shows in Dublin and Belfast.

The artist paint stereotypes rather than individuals, meshing references from the photographic storyboards of romantic comics and their heightened sense of melodrama, with the

more sinister undertones of American film noir and pulp crime novels. The subjects are superficially attractive but there is an underlying sense of their narcissism and perhaps even their engagement in acts which the viewer is compelled to interpret as illicit. As a result, the viewer is cast as a voyeur, the perception of what's taking place in the paintings suspended in a double take, in an ambivalence between observation and accusation.

Colin usually works on panels of wood veneer, framed in linen – a reversal of the traditional materials used. His art heroes are John Currin, Chuck Close and Charles Burns.





Pigcasso and Joanne Lefson represent the first human - non-human art collaboration of its kind.

Pigcasso was rescued just before slaughter in 2016 by Joanne Lefson and taken to Farm Sanctuary SA in Franschhoek, South Africa. When Joanne noticed that Pigcasso ate or destroyed everything except some old paint brushes that were laying in her stall, she decided to nurture the pig's potential talent. It didn't take long before Pigcasso began to paint – and over time, the painting process developed into an extraordinary collaboration between human and pig.

Lefson selects the colours while Pigcasso takes the brush into her mouth and creates her magic across the canvas. Lefson watches from afar, able to stop Pigcasso if she observes an interesting form developing that is relatable to the human eye.

A gallery showcasing the artworks of Pigcasso and Lefson have showcased the art in three landmark exhibitions (Cape Town South Africa 2019 and 2020) Amsterdam September 2021, Hann Munden 2022. In December 2022, Pigcasso when a world-record when one of her artworks 'WILD AND FREE' sold for 20 000 GBP; the most expensive artwork ever sold that was painted by a non-human artist.

Through their extraordinary collaboration, the creatives aim to challenge the status quo; igniting debate on the definition of art, while highlighting the detrimental effects of animal agriculture on the welfare of farmed animals and the environment in order to inspire a kinder, more sustainable world.





From the original 1997 Artificial NYC edition, this print of God Save The Queen is a black or gold on white version. Jamie Reid made several versions of this artwork - this one was used for flyers and promotional items and in many ways is the most infamous of them all. The single was released on 27th May 1977 - at the height of the queen's Silver Jubilee - and has never ceased to shock.

Jamie Reid's longstanding practice as an artist sits firmly within a tradition of English radical dissent that would include, for example, William Blake, Wat Tyler and Gerrard Winstanley. Like them, the work of dissent must offer, out of necessity, other social and spiritual models and Reid's practice is no exception.

Although Reid is known primarily for the deployment of Situationist strategies in his iconic work for the Sex Pistols and Suburban Press, the manifold strands of his art both continue that work whilst showing us other ways in which we can mobilise our energy and spirituality. It is this dialectic between Gnosticism and dissent that lies at the heart of Reid's practice and makes him one of the great English iconoclastic artists.

Dame Zandra Rhodes DBE was born 1940 in Kent, UK. Zandra studied at Medway and then the Royal College London, majoring in printed textiles. Zandra headed the new wave of British designers who put London at the forefront of international fashion in the 1970s. Rhodes' garments have a timeless quality making them unmistakably Rhodes' creations; bold, dynamic, colourful and feminine. She has stamped her identity on the international world of fashion with her spectacular pink hair, theatrical makeup and art jewellery. Zandra designed for

Princess Diana, Freddy Mercury, Diana Ross and Helen Mirren, and has also designed Opera sets and costumes for The Pearl Fishers, Magic Flute and Aida. Rhodes founded the Fashion and Textile Museum London and her exhibition: "Zandra Rhodes, a Lifelong Love Affair with Textiles" has exhibited all over the world. Most recently, she has been given the prestigious title of "Dame" by the Queen of England, and continues to design for companies. Existentialist philosophy serves as the basis for my work, complemented by my fascination for science and current affairs.

Alienation has been a part of human existence throughout history.

I perceive that this has escalated in recent years due to the increased polarisation of viewpoints.

This is happening in a world already impaired by estrangement due to the uncertainty of globalisation, artificial intelligence and hyper inter-connectivity from technology.

I hope for my work to convey an awareness of human interrelation in the world and express the importance of 'positive contamination' by the other; an openness to change via mutual influence, engagement and interaction, and difference and influence.

My working practice emerges from and interacts with my own estrangement, but the process offers me a place to experience a sense of belonging.

It is not a clear road; there are obstacles, and resistance and it is often accompanied by a sense of failure to understand – and in my work, I can at times hear the voice of the chaotic world and experience a magnetic connection with it.

Paul Stephenson lives and works in London. His second London solo show "Fireworks" was in November 2019. He and his work have been described as an "exciting new hybrid between photography and other media, Stephenson is one of the most interesting lens based artists working today."

"Reflection Paintings start life at auction. Stephenson uses a photographic process to permanently superimpose images onto original works. They're the kind of reflections you might pay little attention to, but when they're immortalised in oil on canvas, the effect on the artwork is undeniable. Stephenson explains, 'I started concentrating on these superimposed images, and seeing the beauty in them.' The billowing cloud-like additions to Reflection on Jane Camp, originally painted by Alexander Melville, 1877, redefine Camp's serene expression, and add a mythical aura to an otherwise faceon, austere Victorian portrait."

John Trashkowsky is art for the big questions of our time. One that comes at us every day of the week from all sides. The mission is to surprise us out of our antipsychotic, coffee-swilling, anxiety-ridden, pill-popping paranoia with products that make us want to jump out of our skin, with joy or irritation. The choice of ingredients is thrilling anyway.

The work of the artist was once described as "the laugh that remains in neck stuck". At the first sight, his work is very inviting, playful and accessible to all. While on the second sight has a deep message and is an argument with the big questions of our time. The topics come from the recent cover stories in the press and deal with politics, economics, environment, resources, war and the consequences for society. The selection of material is also very important for him. He often works with materials with symbolic power like dollars, barbwire, blood, a scale and so on. With this, he develops fresh and modern ready-made with a surprising and meaningful twist. The artist started as a teenager with graffiti, was a rapper in a Hip Hop group, works today in the creative industry and expresses his personal perspective of global conflicts in his work.

Alexandros is a polymath - a practitioner of fine art and optical experimentation. Post extensive studies in Architecture, Urban Design, history of Art and Computer Programming, Alexandros expanded his field of operations as part of United Visual Artists for over a decade. In 2018, he moved on to pursue a solo, but even more diverse career combining artistic and commercial ventures under the roles of visual artist, creative director, masterplanner, architect and creative consultant.

Influenced by nature, ancient culture and mythology, deep time, optics and acoustics, Alexandros' artistic work is expressed via sculpture, visual (physical/digital) applications, architecture and scenography for contemporary ballet and performance. Working in various scales, his preferred mediums include raw materials – such as marble, steel or paper and ink, optics and photography, code, lighting and atmospherics, while his process involves narratives, worldbuilding and sketches, 3d modelling and prototyping, image manipulation and advanced fabrication techniques.

Alexandros has worked with(in) major cultural institutions to create unique environments and artworks including Barbican, Royal Academy of Arts, Southbank Centre, National Maritime Museum, Towner Gallery YCAM Japan, United Nations, Fondation Cartier, La Gaite Lyrique, Palais Garnier and many others.






Born in Turks and Caicos, raised between New York and Miami, Bradley Theodore eventually moved back to New York where his artistic career took off. Theodore's beginnings as an artist came from adorning the streets of New York City with vibrant, chromatic murals of skeletons depicting contemporary pop culture and fashion "royalty." Bradley Theodore is known for his colourful paintings and prints of fashion icons.

He is a multi-disciplinary artist whose iconoclastic approach to art can be found internationally, from 10-foot murals on the streets of New York, Tokyo, and Milan, to soldout solo exhibitions in London. Evoking the universality of colour, skeletons, and celebrity, Bradley Theodore distils figures to skeletal forms, a confrontation that the artist calls "an act of living", pushing colour to express memory, emotion, and lived experiences.

Theodore's portraits juxtapose the legendary and mortal qualities of modern and contemporary fashion icons, and the artist has become a staple in the art and fashion scene in New York City. Theodore has collaborated with popular artists and brands on creative projects, including Moët, Rolls-Royce, and Moleskine.

LR Vandy (British of Nigerian/Irish descent) studied Graphic Design & Printmaking at Camberwell College of Arts before completing her Master's Degree in Furniture Design at the Royal College of Art.

The current Hull series of sculptures takes model boat hulls and transforms them into masks adorned with fishing floats, porcupine quills, and acupuncture needles. Using a mixture of found and made objects the work aims to make new meaning from seemingly unrelated mediums forced together.

In 2018 L R Vandy made her sell-out debut in London which was followed by her highly an ticipated first solo show at October Gallery in June 2019. Magnus Grimsson, Kristjana's grandfather, fought in the Cod War in Iceland. The Cod War was a series of confrontations between the United Kingdom and Iceland on fishing rights in the North Atlantic. All of the disputes ended with an Icelandic victory. Kristjana's spent a lot of her youth in her grandfather's living room, drawing maps and imagining people at sea. In time spent with her grandfather, Kristjana has vivid memories of her grandfather creating troller nets, which were fascinatingly gigantic and almost neon green. The artwork Calm At Sea,

depicts Kristjana's ideal scenario when at sea, where the intrepid travellers meet her vivid imagination.



Joy Wolfenden Brown is a British artist born in Stamford, Lincolnshire in 1961. She currently lives in Bude, North Cornwall. Wolfenden Brown's intimate oil paintings feel hauntingly familiar possessing a raw, emotional, honesty. She captures fleeting fragments of memory, moments in time where the inherent vulnerability of the figures depicted, often in isolation, is palpable. These are lovingly yet spontaneously executed reflections on the human condition, which have an unnervingly, yet simultaneously comforting, unquarded quality.

Joy worked as an art therapist for ten years before moving to Cornwall in 1999. Wolfenden Brown has had a number of sell out solo exhibitions and was the First Prize Winner in The National Open Art Competition, 2012.

Works were acquired by the Anthony Pettullo Outsider Art Collection in Milwaukee with further works held in collections worldwide. Wolfenden Brown has exhibited internationally with four solo exhibitions at Anima Mundi marking a long and fruitful working relationship. Joy Wolfenden Brown is represented by Anima Mundi.

Osman Yousefzada is a British-Pakistani interdisciplinary artist and writer, engaging with the representation, rupture and reimagining of the migration experience. He works across moving image, installation, sculpture, textile, and performance, referring to the socio-political issues of today. Osman's practice is led by modes of storytelling, merging autobiography with fiction and ritual.

His work has been shown at notable international institutions including, Whitechapel Gallery, London; Ikon Gallery, Birmingham; Museum of Contemporary Art, Sydney; Wapping Project, London; Cincinnati Art Museum, Ohio; Ringling Museum, Florida; Lahore Museum, Pakistan; Design Museum, London; Lahore Biennale, Pakistan; and Dhaka Art Summit, Bangladesh. Osman is a research practitioner at the Royal College of Art, London and Visiting Fellow Jesus College, Cambridge University.

Osman's practice has been described as "defiant", where the participating bodies throughout his work are presented as part objects that refuse to identify or conform. Most recently, his series of solo interventions titled What Is Seen & What Is Not was shown at the Victoria and Albert Museum in South Kensington, London. Across three site-specific works, this presentation responded to the 75th anniversary of Pakistan and explored themes of displacement, movement, migration, and climate change.

In his memoir, The Go-Between (2022), set in Birmingham in the 1980s and 1990s, alternative masculinities compete with strict gender roles while female erasure and honour-based violence are committed, even as empowering female friendships prevail. This first book was long listed for the Polari Prize and reviewed by Stephen Fry as "one of the greatest childhood memoirs of our time".



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
